Provide a narrative on progress toward meeting the goals outlined above.

Currently, 94% of Fennville Pre-School students are meeting Benchmark for Acadience Reading Pre-K PELI composite scores. Specifically, within the Alphabet Knowledge measure, 67% of 3-5 year olds are At Benchmark and 100% of students have improved in this measure (two students had already reached the maximum score and maintained this maximum.) Within the Phonological Awareness measure, 85% of 3-5 year olds are At Benchmark and 94% of students improved in this measure.

As of June 2022, performance on Alphabet Knowledge has improved for students 3-5 on the Acadience Reading Pre-L PELI measure. In the Winter, 4 students scored Well Below Benchmark. As of June 2022, 3 students scored Well Below Benchmark.
