CLASS OF 2023

On the evening of Thursday, May 25th, Fennville High School welcomed its newest group of alumni, the Class of 2023. The celebration took place in the Morehead Gymnasium in front of a packed crowd of family, friends, and community members. Fennville Public Schools Superintendent, Jim Greydanus, welcomed all in attendance as he kicked off his last commencement ceremony due to his retirement at the end of this school year. The night was filled with excitement for what is to come, and sprinkled with reflection on the past years of being students at FPS.

To celebrate the night the graduates welcomed Senior Class Vice President Wendy Gonzalez and Jessica Garcia, a Senior Class Representative, to give Commencement Addresses. Principal Albert Lombard had the honor of announcing that the Class of 2023 had been awarded a grand total of \$1,216,011 worth of college merit and scholarships. Seventeen graduates wore a gold chord indicating a GPA of 3.5 or above, while 15 more students wore a silver chord for a 3.0 - 3.49 GPA. To conclude the evening, the 73 graduating seniors tossed their caps high into the air outside the west doors of the gym.

GREAT LAKES ECOLOGY CLASS RELEASE SALMON

On April 28th students from Mrs. Gray's Great Lakes Ecology class, along with 6th graders from FMS, released 100 young salmon into the Kalamazoo River at New Richmond Bridge Park. Mrs. Gray said this was the most successful year of the activity.

Prior to the release of the salmon, high school students led five stations on both sides of the river on the topics of salmon scents, fishing, a scavenger hunt, water quality testing, and salmon life cycle.

The program began back in 2014 as an after-school club and developed into an elective course last school year. The Fennville Educational Foundation has provided grants for the class to improve equipment and supplies for the course, specifically a larger tank, new filter, and materials for water quality testing. Fennville is one of approximately 150 schools in the state to participate in such a program, which works with the Michigan Department of Natural Resources to coordinate the release.

FENNVILLE SCHOOLS CONTINUE TO SUPPORT THE GROWTH OF THEIR STAFF

Throughout the years Fennville Public Schools has continued to support its own staff to grow in their profession. As the shortage of educators continues, FPS turns to grants and partnering with local universities to help grow their staff.

This year, we have our first cohort of graduates through Western Michigan University with a Masters Degree in Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages (TESOL). When asked to describe their experience one teacher said "My attitude and mindset as an educator has been forever changed."

Also this year, FPS was awarded over \$1.5 Million in a grant called "Grow your Own." The Michigan Department of Education created this grant to support school employees in earning initial teacher certification or adding additional endorsements on

to an existing teacher certification. FPS is collaborating with Grand Valley State University to provide this cost-free opportunity to grow our own educators to better serve our students and community.







Ms. Godwin has been a teacher at Fennville Public Schools for 23 years. She started at Fennville in 2001 at FMS then would later move to the elementary school in 2007 where she finished her career teaching 4th grade. Ms. Godwin has been a fixture in the community as an educator and a proud parent of 3 FPS graduates. Ms. Godwin looks to spend more time in the greenhouse planting beautiful flowers. 
