COVID-19 Case Update January 13, 2022

Fennville Public Schools will share regular updates on the District website www.fennville.org. When a positive case is reported to Fennville Public Schools staff, we will work with the Allegan County Health Department to ensure the safety of our students and staff.

On Tuesday, January 4, 2022, a staff member was on campus at Fennville Public Schools who developed symptoms of COVID-19 within 48 hours of being on campus and later tested positive.

On Wednesday, January 5, 2022, two students were on campus at Fennville High School who developed symptoms of COVID-19 within 48 hours of being on campus and later tested positive.

On Monday, January 10, 2022, a student was on campus at Fennville Middle School who developed symptoms of COVID-19 within 48 hours of being on campus and later tested positive.

On Wednesday, January 12, 2022, a student was on campus at Fennville High School who developed symptoms of COVID-19 within 48 hours of being on campus and later tested positive.

On Wednesday, January 12, 2022, a staff member was on campus at Fennville Public Schools who developed symptoms of COVID-19 within 48 hours of being on campus and later tested positive.

Thank you for understanding that, due to medical privacy laws, we are not able to release the names of the individuals with COVID-19. We will continue to communicate changes and updates with you. With your participation, we believe we can maintain a safe environment while also providing quality education.

This information does not mean you should quarantine or isolate. Those members of the School Community who were or are suspected to have been in Close Contact with a School Associated Case will be notified by Allegan County Health Department and/or Fennville Public Schools.

Due to widespread infections with COVID-19 within our community, the ACHD recommends parents continue to assess their children prior to leaving home. Symptoms to be watching for are (new/different/worse from baseline of any chronic illness):

1. Temperature 100.4 or higher signs of fever (chills/sweating)
2. Sore throat
3. Uncontrolled cough
4. Difficulty breathing or shortness of breath
5. Diarrhea, vomiting, or abdominal pain
6. Severe headache
7. Loss of taste or smell

It is recommended that your child be tested for COVID-19 if they get any of these symptoms. You can call 2-1-1 or go to www.michigan.gov/coronavirustest for testing locations.
