Dear Parent/Guardian of a Fennville High School Student,

This letter is to inform you that an individual from Fennville High School was recently diagnosed with COVID-19 and is currently at home in isolation. The Allegan County Health Department (ACHD) has investigated the situation and all close contacts are being notified through a separate letter and will be home in quarantine.

Due to widespread infections with COVID-19 within our community, the ACHD recommends parents continue to assess their children prior to leaving home. Symptoms to be watching for are (new/different/worse from baseline of any chronic illness):

1. Temperature 100.4 or higher signs of fever (chills/sweating)
2. Sore throat
3. Uncontrolled cough
4. Difficulty breathing or shortness of breath
5. Diarrhea, vomiting, or abdominal pain
6. Severe headache
7. Loss of taste or smell
