E. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Jim Greydanus

- The Fennville Education Foundation reached a tentative agreement on the language of the contract. The FEA will reconvene in November to determine the rest of the days for second semester and pay scale.
- Mr. Greydanus gave a brief explanation on the action items of the evening's agenda, and an update on the bond project.
- Mr. Greydanus reported on the legislature update on pupil count.
- The Continuity of Learning Plan will need to have a reconfirmation of the delivery of instruction approved by the board monthly.
- Building principals will present their Return to Learn Plan in detail.
- Mr. Greydanus provided an update on the cleaning solution Orbio that the district is using to keep the facilities disinfected, and the Beaver solution the Transportation Department is using to disinfect busses.

- Students attending the ACATEC program will do so in person, Mr. Greydanus reported.
- Mrs. Renberg asked the reason why students in high school cannot eat breakfast on campus.
- Mrs. Eckhardt decided high school students would be taking their breakfast kits home once per week to help control number of times per day masks would need to be taken off.

- Mr. Thiele inquired as to the type of benchmark assessment the district would be providing.

- Mr. Johnson inquired if it would be possible for the elementary to host an Open House for kindergarten students and their families.


